

Year 7 English

Overview: English at Year 7 will build on key skills that students have learned at Key Stage 2, as well as starting to prepare them for the demands of the iGCSE course. The three main areas of focus are reading skills, writing skills, and analysis of literature.

Students will begin the course with an introduction to the core skills needed at Key Stage 3 English. They will then analyse a fiction novel using these skills. In the spring term, students will hone their non-fiction writing skills, before learning how to critically examine a range of dystopic fiction. In the summer term, they will analyse a collection of poetry including works by Lemn Sissay and Emily Clarke. They will complete the year building on their critical analysis skills

through the exploration of non-fiction texts.
