Year 10 History

Overview: The two-year History course is designed to prepare students for their EDEXCEL iGCSE History examinations. The course is assessed via two external examinations at the end of Year 11. The topics selected have been designed to give students a detailed understanding of four fascinating periods in history, but also to enable them to better understand the world in which we live today.

Paper 1 requires students to delve into two "depth studies". The periods covered are South Africa from union to the end of apartheid 1948-1994 and colonial rule and the nationalist challenge in India 1919-1947. Students will learn about these topics in the first year of the course. In the Summer Term, they will begin work on Paper 2 of the examination, which focuses on the origins of World War One.

Paper 1 is worth 50% of the overall GCSE score.
