

## **Year 11 English**

**Overview:** At the end of Year 11, students will sit their iGCSE English Language examination. This consists of two external examinations. The language course is designed to hone students' analytical and writing skills – both are essential life skills that they will take with them into the adult world.

Paper 1 will require students to analyse one of ten non-fiction texts which have been studied in class. They will be asked to compare one of these core texts with an unseen non-fiction text. They will also be required to write one piece of transactional (non-fiction) writing, such as a speech or an article. This paper is worth 60% of the overall GCSE grade.

Paper 2 requires students to write an essay analysing one of ten poems or short stories that will have been studied in class. They will also be required to write a piece of creative writing. This paper is worth 40% of the overall GCSE grade.
